




Amidst wildfires and a crippling global pandemic, DSBK survives 2020 with its finances and core membership intact.

## Virtual Outreach

The Board made a concerted effort to boost DSBK's online presence. Through free, guided consultations with a local business owner/investor, the dojo's Facebook page now boasts 106 followers (and growing). In a one-month snapshot, posts about our inventive outdoor practices reached 145 people (314% increase).

The dojo also branched out across the social media landscape, opening an Instagram account. This presence has attracted 155 followers (and growing).














## Adapting to Reality
